When Governor Rendell signed HB 2200 into law as Act 129 the legislation imposed new requirements on electric distribution companies with the overall goal of reducing energy consumption and demand. The Governor's office estimates that the Act's provisions will help residential, commercial and industrial customers save \$500 million over five years.

The PUC and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are actively involved in the implementation process for Act 129. These three lunchtime programs will explore this new area of opportunity and will explain Act 129 from the vantage point of 'what it is', 'how to take advantage' and 'what are the benefits'. You are invited to attend one, two or all three seminars.

Intro to Act 129

Act 129 directed that all electric distribution companies with at least 100,000 customers develop and file an energy efficiency and conservation plan with the Commission for approval. Most utility plans have been approved and were effective December 1, 2009.

This program will feature management staff who will explain the current status of deregulation, the utility requirements and goals as part of Act 129, the development of Duquesne Light's Energy Efficiency and Demand Side Response Plan, the programs available for residential, commercial and industrial customers and future expectations.

Practical Applications for Act 129

Act 129 utilizes a broad range of programs that help users cost effectively reduce energy consumption. However, there are very specific PUC rules and guidelines to be adhered to and this seminar will clarify the process to a great extent.

Conservation Service Providers assist companies with everything from financing,

to equipment specification and rebate paperwork. This program will cover potential savings, audits, benchmarking studies, project oversight and paperwork required for customers to receive rebates after equipment is installed and verified. An overview of the Technical Resource Manual will be provided and examples of prescriptive and customized rebates will be covered.
